## CHAPTER SUMMARY

One God in three eternal persons makes more sense than monotheism, especially when we consider what “God is love” means before Creation. We can trust God the Father to be father, God the Son to be savior, and God the Holy Spirit to dwell in us.

- Why is it important to reject modalism (or “moodalism” as Reeves called it)? What do we lose when God changes from one person to another and back again?
- What illustration would you use now to explain the Trinity to someone else?
